#### 5<sup>th</sup> May – Pet Week

#### Assessment dates to note for this term

End of KS1 assessments are now **non-statutory**. The reception baseline assessment (RBA) is used as the baseline for primary progress measures. We use optional end of KS1 tests in school. These materials will be used to give you an indication of the attainment of your child in preparation for KS2. Year 2 optional SATs assessments take place in school between 1<sup>st</sup> and the 31<sup>st</sup> May. Year 1 Phonics screening will take place week commencing 9<sup>th</sup> June.

Please refrain from speaking to the children about these at home; these assessments are carried out by class teachers who are familiar to the children and we do not want the children to feel any pressure or nerves whatsoever.
