## Message from our Headteacher

We hope that you have all had a wonderful summer break. A warm welcome to our new Nursery and Reception families. A brief overview of the Government Guidelines for the September opening of schools are shown in the table below. Can a child/adult attend school?	Yes :	All children MUST attend school unless they are ill. Under-18s (+6months) irrespective of their vaccination status, double vaccinated adults (14 days after their final dose), anyone taking part in a COVID-19 vaccine trial, or anyone not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons will not need to self-isolate if they are a close contact of a positive case. They will be strongly advised to take a PCR test and, if positive, will need to isolate.
	No .	If a child/adult develops COVID symptoms at home, they should <u>stay at home</u> and should book a PCR test, <u>NOT</u> a Lateral Flow test. If a child/adult develops COVID symptoms at school, they will be sent home and should book a PCR test. If a child/adult tests positive for COVID, they will need to self-isolate. The rest of the household does not need to self-isolate if they are under 18 or fully vaccinated – and will be strongly advised to book a PCR test.

This newsletter contains a brief summary of some of the school improvements being introduced across the school this term. Each week year group leads will send you more in-depth information specific to classes so that you will be able to fully support your child at home.

Building on our successful implementation of the writing and reading rainbows (The Write Stuff & Hooked on Books), this year we are introducing the spelling rainbow in Year 2.
