Thank you to you all for the wonderful projects that have been sent into school. The children spoke with great enthusiasm about making them and are very proud to see their projects on display.




Monday 15th March

Home - Turn On The Subtitles – 30 minutes a week!

Turning on the subtitles while children are watching television can **double the chances of a child becoming good at reading**†. †Based on an academic study of 2,350 children, 34% became good readers with schooling alone. But when exposed to 30 minutes a week of subtitled film songs, that proportion more than doubled to 70%.





School Library
